LEAD AND ZINC MARKET FORECASTS

The Group's latest outlook for world supply and demand for lead and zinc was put forward and approved during the ILZSG meetings held on 20 and 21 October 2022.

Lead Usage

After rising by 4.6% in 2021, global demand for refined lead metal was forecast to rise by 0.8% in 2022 and by 1.4% in 2023

Lead Supply

World lead mine production was forecast to remain flat in 2022 and rise by 2.7% in 2023. World refined lead production was expected to fall by 0.3% in 2022 and rise by 1.8% in 2023.

World Refined Lead Metal Balance

Global demand of refined lead metal was expected to exceed supply by 83,000 tonnes and 42,000 tonnes in 2022 and 2023 respectively.

Zinc Usage

World demand for refined zinc metal was forecast to fall by 1.9% in 2022 and to rise by 1.5% in 2023.

Zinc Supply

World zinc mine production was predicted to decrease by 0.9% in 2022 and to rise by 2.7% in 2023. Global refined zinc metal production was forecast to fall by 2.7% in 2022 and to increase by 2.6% in 2023.

World Refined Zinc Metal Balance

Demand for refined zinc metal was forecast to exceed supply by about 297,000 tonnes and 150,000 tonnes in 2022 and in 2023 respectively.

COPPER MARKET FORECASTS

A revised and updated world balance of refined copper production and usage was developed and agreed at the ICSG meetings held on 18 and 19 October 2022.

Copper Supply

World copper mine production was expected to increase by 3.9% and 5.3% in 2022 and 2023 respectively. World refined copper production was expected to rise by 2.8% in 2022 and 3.3% in 2023.

Copper Usage

World apparent refined copper usage was forecast to grow by about 2.2% in 2022 and 1.4% in 2023.

World Refined Copper Metal Balance

World refined copper balance projections indicated a deficit of about 328,000t for 2022 and a surplus of 155,000t in 2023.

NICKEL MARKET FORECASTS

The most recent INSG production and usage forecasts for world primary nickel were discussed in detail and ratified at the Group's meetings on 17 and 18 October.

Primary Nickel Production

World primary nickel production was 2.612Mt in 2021, and was forecast to reach 3.036Mt and 3.387Mt in 2022 and 2023 respectively.

Primary Nickel Usage

World primary nickel usage was 2.775Mt in 2021. The INSG forecasts an increase to 2.892Mt in 2022 and 3.216Mt in 2023.

World Primary Nickel Balance

The implicit market balances are therefore a deficit of 163kt in 2021, and surpluses of 144kt in 2022 and 171kt in 2023.

Francisco Donoso, Representative of the Chilean Copper Commission COCHILCO, delivered a presentation that focused on the challenges Chile faces as a mining country and the main policies that the government is promoting to maintain Chile's position at the top of the global copper industry.

Simon Hunt, Founder and Owner of Simon Hunt Strategic Services Ltd (London, UK and Dubai, UAE), made a presentation on copper and copper alloy products as wire rod, brass mills and semis and their raw materials, refined copper and scrap.

JOINT ICSG ILZSG INSG SEMINAR "THE ROLE OF METALS IN THE TRANSITION TO GREEN ENERGY"

On Wednesday, 19 October 2022 at the Altis Grand Hotel in Lisbon Portugal, representatives from the governments of the copper, lead, zinc and nickel Study Groups met with industry and academic experts. The objective was to discuss the role of metals in the transition to green energy.

Paul White, the Common Secretary-General of ILZSG/ICSG/INSG, made some opening remarks summarising the essential role metals will play as the world gradually transitions to using increasing amounts of renewable energy.

Hajime Myoi, President, Metals Economic Research Institute (MERIJ), Japan, discussed "Japanese Challenges to Green Energy in the Metals Sector".

Titas Anuskevicius, DG Grow, European Commission, emphasized the "Importance of Metals to the Future of Energy in Europe".

Alistair Davidson, Director, Consortium for Battery Innovation (CBI), presented a summary of the CBI's recent work on lead-based batteries and their role in the transition to green energy.

Gary Stanley, Director, Office of Materials Industries, International Trade Administration, U.S. Dept of Commerce, briefed the audience on "U.S. Government Efforts in Supporting the Transition to Green Energy".

Alastair Ramsay, Vice President, Rystad Energy, United Kingdom, assessed the implication for metals of the expected rise in demand for renewable energy and the downturn in the use of fossil fuels.

Alex Griffiths, Metals and Mining Analyst, Wood Mackenzie, analysed the question of "Could Constraints in Metal Supply Impede the Transition?".

Key Takeaways from the Joint Seminar

- 1. Strong consensus on the essential role of metals in an achievable transition to green economy was again stressed. Market transparency and effective communications between the industry, government and other stakeholders will play a crucial role in ensuring a smooth, inclusive, equitable, and sustainable transition to the low carbon economy, in achieving the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), and in meeting the targets set in the Paris Treaty.
- 2. While looking at the carbon peak and carbon neutrality goals of an individual country, it should be noted that climate change is a global challenge to be tackled collectively and collaboratively. The necessity and urgency for cooperation in pooling resources to meet the demand for metals for the green transition is stark.
- 3. Political will and policy support needs to be furthered in securing diversified supply chains. This includes geographical diversification and developing resilient domestic capacities that cover both primary metal production and recycling.
- 4. The green transition comes with a growing energy requirement and this is likely to lead to exponential demand growth for metals. Thus, all existing and emerging technologies should be adapted and, where necessary, further innovated to meet this demand.
- 5. The identification of critical minerals in meeting the green transition needs and the strategies for securing the supply of those minerals are already at the top of government agendas.
- 6. Sizeable investment is expected to be drawn to the minerals and metals sectors if the increased demand for metals is to be met.
- 7. Strict scrutiny of environment, social and governance issues related to minerals and metals sector is already in place and is expected to be strengthened further in order to minimize any potential adverse impacts of the green transition.
- 8. The International Metals Study Groups (ILZSG, INSG and ICSG) provide continuous market transparency and are unbiased platforms for the discussion of issues of common concern and interest to member governments.




